# **Authors and Guns**

How many of you have written something involving guns? My guess is that most of you have. As crime fiction writers, it's almost impossi-



ble not to. Some character pulls a gun or finds a gun or refuses to use a gun or sees law enforcement with a gun. Then you as the writer have choices to make. What kind of gun? How is it held? Is it clean? Dirty? What does all of this say about your character?

These are tough questions, especially if you don't know much about firearms. This month, we're here to help. At our members' meeting **April 20**, you'll hear from Army veteran **Karl Henwood**, who is experienced in many different types of rifles, handguns, artillery and more. Karl is also a writer, so he understands the crazy scenarios our minds invent and how realistic we want to make them. This will be an educational, research-centered presentation.

Here's what Karl will cover as he talks about how to incorporate firearms into your writing: a brief history of firearms as a technology, a short history of American gun culture, basic marksmanship, types of firearms, and where and why they're used, terminal ballistics—what bullets actually do when they hit things, weapon choice, maintenance and their implications for writing.

And yes, there will be Q&A at the end!

Then on **May 19**, Karl is offering an in-person gun range day at his family ranch north of Sacramento. Registration for that will open up later on. Watch the Capitol Crimes website for more details.

- 2. Your story must address the *Farm to Foul Play* theme.
- 3. Your story must include a crime.
- 4. AND it has to be set in the Sacramento region, or if you must stray go no further than NorCal.


## MEET THE AUTHOR with ELIZABETH CROWENS

Karl's Zoom talk will cover a brief history of firearms as a technology; a short history of American gun culture; basic marksmanship; terminal ballistics-what bullets actually do when they hit things; types of firearms and where and why they are used; and weapon choice and maintenance and their implications for writing.

The latest in Claire's Sheriff Hank Worth series, Home Fires, comes out April 2.


