The deadline to submit your short story is May 31.

- 1. Word count is 1,500 to 5,000 words.
- 2. You must be a Capitol Crimes member in good standing, which means you're a current member of Sisters in Crime AND Capitol Crimes.
- 3. Your story must address the *Farm to Foul Play* theme.
- 4. Your story must include a crime.
- 5. AND it has to be set in the Sacramento region, or if you must stray, go no further than NorCal.




